

My son's program requires that he occlude his left ear for 7 days. This seemed to be a bit much at first; so I started to research, "Does he really need to do this much occluding?" His program was overwhelming to me and my family. We didn't want people looking at him strange in public. I would say we occluded 75% of the requested program. We got okay improvements in his schoolwork and about all daily function across the board. What happened was my son started to tell he wanted to plug his ear. Something was changing for him. This is the only thing on the program after he got use to doing we didn't have to encourage him to 100%. He just had his big 3 year eval (IEP) at school. He made a huge jump in all areas. They praised his accomplishments; as they reviewed his test scores they commented, "What you're doing at home is really working."

Last week Marilee tested my son. We both were really pleased with the results. It's not what you do more or part of the time that bring out amazing results. It's what you do 100% of the time. The program was really hard for use when we did it 60 to 75% of the time. When you stick with it and do it all the time you become more organized and you see amazing results. Our children are worth it.
